BHNCDSB has a new letter/form for parents who require a new VSC (Vulnerable Sector Check) in order to volunteer at school, chaperone on field trips, etc. The new letter is now electronic and must be emailed to the parent after being signed by the principal. It is then uploaded to police services when completing the VSC request online. You can contact the office if you require this form to apply/renew your VSC.

Did you know??? Your Vulnerable Sector Check is non-transferrable, meaning, if you have one to coach your child's sports team (hockey, soccer, etc.) you cannot use the same one to volunteer at school.

November 1, 2023—Feast of All Saints Day

Mass at 6:30 followed by

Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

All Saints' Day is a solemn holy day of the Catholic Church and is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven. Although millions, or even billions of people may already be saints, including some of our loved ones who have died, today, also recognizes the known saints canonized by the Church. Only saints attain heaven, therefore, we call on the intercession of the saints and by their example guide us along the path of holiness.

November 2, 2023—All Soul's Day

Mass at 7:00pm

All Souls Day is a holy day set aside for honoring our beloved dead. According to Catholic belief, the soul of a person who dies can go to one of three places. The first is heaven, where a person who dies in a state of perfect grace and communion with God goes. The second is hell, where those who die in a state of mortal sin are naturally condemned by their choice. The third is purgatory, which is thought to be where most people, free of mortal sin, but still in a state of lesser (venial) sin, must go. Consistent with these teachings and traditions, Catholics believe that through the prayers of the faithful on Earth and our offerings, the dead are assisted in their purification to enter into heaven.

First Communion Dates
