

<u>Language</u>

I am continually testing your child to see their progress and to find different teaching strategies to help them become fluent readers. Every student in my class is moving along at their own pace. I always like to use the analogy of the Turtle and the Hair. Reading is not a race. Each child acquires his/her language skills at different stages in his/her development. My goal is to encourage my students to develop a love of reading so that they become lifelong readers! Remember, in K to 3 students are learning to read and from grade 3 onwards, students are reading to learn! Thank you for supporting your child on this journey!

For writing we are focusing on making sure that we have all the proper conventions such as capitals, periods and spaces. We have spent the last week writing about

personal opinions. Our class has had several opportunities to write about their opinion on a variety of subjects

Math

We just finished an entire month of Number Sense. Students practiced addition to 20. I will continue to imbed number sense activities into our centers so that students get lots of practice. For November, we will shift our focus to Data Management and Probability. We will begin this unit by creating a bar graph of our favorite Halloween treats!
